Dr. Richard Willson is a professor in the Department of Urban and Regional Planning at California State Polytechnic University, Pomona. He has previously served as chair of the Department of Urban and Regional Planning and Interim Dean of the College of Environmental Design. His research addresses climate change, land/use transportation relationships, travel demand management, transit-oriented development, and parking policy. Prior to his academic career, Dr. Willson was a transportation planner for the City of Los Angeles Community Redevelopment Agency.

Dr. Wilson give an overview of transit oriented development (TOD), focusing on the transition on the initial round of TOD's and opportunities for more effective TOD's in the future.
