SUBJECT: UPDATE AND/OR ACTION REGARDING ECO-RAPID TRANSIT'S NORTHERN CORRIDOR AND HIGH SPEED RAIL ALTERNATIVES

ISSUE

Eco-Rapid Transit staff will provide an update and seeks your guidance and input regarding next steps for the Eco-Rapid Transit Northern Corridor and California High Speed Rail Authority.

BACKGROUND

Eco-Rapid Transit staff has been working on issues related to high speed rail in the northern corridor. At the direction of the Board of Directors, we are in support of a concept to bring high speed rail to Southern California with service from Hollywood Burbank Airport to Union Station and to Anaheim.

We also submitted a comment letter to the California High Speed Rail Authority (CHSRA) re the Draft Burbank to Los Angeles Section Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Impact Statement (EIR/EIS). Eco-Rapid Transit supports high speed rail from Hollywood Burbank Airport to Union Station and on to Anaheim but expressed our concerns, especially as it relates to a real need to build upon existing uses in the Hollywood Burbank Airport station area.

As part of our research effort, staff included excerpts from a Mineta Institute Study authored by Anastasia Loukaitou-Sideris, Ph.D., Deike Peters, Ph.D. and Wenbin Wei Ph.D. that looks at Promoting Connectivity at California's High-Speed Rail Stations (July 2015). It includes a section on the Hollywood Burbank Airport Station, looking at the station's intermodality and connectivity that could create a plane to train connection with the possibility of promoting and enhancing airport business rather than just building a surface parking lot as proposed by CHSRA.
